The table below explains how to handle conflict of interest provisions in proposal guidelines for some of UCSB's most common sponsors. The Sponsored Projects team will advise as to conflict of interest procedures for all other sponsors.

\*\*\*NOTE\*\*\* Sponsors denoted with an \* require COI disclosures to be included with the proposal. This means that the PI must fill out the appropriate COI disclosure form and submit it to the Office of Research as soon as s/he decides to submit to the proposal call.
